



Food from the Field:

Harvest-time study visits by primary schools.

The award-winning Almond Valley Heritage Centre offers a unique range of educational activities and demonstrations for visiting primary school groups. During the Autumn term, there's opportunity to join in the harvest and discover where food comes from. There's a choice of two discovery sessions:

In our **FIELD** activity, groups walk to our demonstration plots to study a variety of cereal, root and leaf crops. After learning about the uses and cultivation of food crops, children can lend a hand with the harvest, taking specimens of each crop back to school.

Our **MILL** activity studies how cereal crops are processed into flour and other food products. Within the historic watermill buildings, children can participate in processes such as threshing sheaves of oats, using the fanner to separate grain from chaff, and grinding flour in the quern.

These discovery sessions are led by experienced demonstrators and will be adapted to suit the age and ability of the class and the course of study being followed. Sessions last about 30 minutes and involve a group of 15 - 20 children at any one time.

There's also much to see on a self-guided basis including the wartime garden, orchard, historic harvest machinery, a working water mill and of course the livestock of Mill Farm.

Your visit can be self-guided or incorporate ONE discovery session. We suggest that you allow at least two hours for your visit, although we find that many schools stay much longer, typically arriving at about 10.30 am and staying until about 2pm. Covered accommodation is available for eating packed lunches and all other facilities are available to ensure a safe, rewarding and enjoyable visit.

Harvest-time visits can be booked by primary schools between August and October. In the event of poor weather, mill-based demonstrations can be substituted for field activities.

Admission for harvest-time visits costs £3.00 per child, with FREE admission for accompanying teachers and parent helpers.

The charge includes access to the "adventure zone" indoor play area if required. Tractor and trailer rides (50p) and a session in the Morag's Meadow soft play (£1) are each available but must be booked in advance.

Your booking will be confirmed as soon as we receive your form, and a timetable of activities will be sent out no less than a week before your visit.

Wellies are advised for field demonstrations.
